To broaden the choice of subjects, we are working in partnership with Cannock Chase High School. This allows us to provide each student with a more varied pathway for their post 16 choices and also gives us the ability to merge any courses where numbers are low and therefore normally would not be viable to run. Please note that there may be subjects where numbers are too low across both schools and therefore will be withdrawn completely from the curriculum proposal.

1. Please consider your choices carefully. Future degree courses and careers may require certain A levels. Please do your research and gain as much career advice as possible.
2. You should make 3 choices, in order of preference. However, if you are expected to gain **7 or more GCSEs at A or A***(or equivalent) you have the option to study a fourth subject. If you fall into that category please select a fourth subject.
3. If you want to study a BTEC Level 3 (single) course then it will take up one of your option choices. A double will take up two and the triple will use three.
4. The blocks will be designed to ensure that the majority of subjects that complement each other are separated to avoid clashes wherever possible.
5. On receipt of your application we will ask you to attend an interview. Your application and your option choices will be discussed with you and you will be offered further advice and guidance in the option process. If there are any clashes these will be discussed during the interview to see if a resolution can be found.

SIXTH FORM CODE OF CONDUCT

You are expected to:

- Have an outstanding attendance record
- Ensure you are punctual to all lessons and study periods
- College photographic identification must be worn at all times
- Remain on the school premises all day except for lessons attended at Cannock Chase High School or unless you have had an absence sanctioned by the Head of Sixth Form.
- Obtain permission in advance for any absence
- Contact the Sixth Form Office before 9am each morning reporting any illness or reason for absence (including lateness) – the phone call should be preferably be made by a parent/guardian
- Embrace and respect the Catholic ethos of the school

You are also expected to:-

- Attend school in accordance with the timings of the school day.
- Attend daily Tutor time and weekly Assembly
- Apply the dress code at all times
- Commit to a minimum of 5 hours independent study per subject per week in addition to lesson time.
